By completing this Elector Response Form **I OPPOSE** the Village of Ashcroft Council's intention to adopt "Ashcroft Water Treatment Plant Upgrade Loan Authorization Bylaw No. 803, 2016" which authorizes the borrowing of up to \$4,128,739 to be repaid over a period not exceeding 30 years in order to finance the costs of Upgrades to the Ashcroft Water Treatment Plant, unless a vote is held.

POST MARKS WILL NOT BE ACCPETED AS MEETING SUBMISSION DATE. Original signatures are required, therefore the Elector Response Forms may not be returned by email or fax.

The Village of Ashcroft Council may proceed with the adoption of Bylaw No. 803, "Ashcroft Water Treatment Plant Upgrade Loan Authorization Bylaw, 2016" unless 148 electors (10% of eligible electors) sign and submit a completed copy of this elector response form to the local government by the deadline.

A person must not sign more than one elector response form in relation to this alternative approval process.

Alternative Approval Process—Elector Response Form

The Village of Ashcroft Council intends to adopt “Ashcroft Water Treatment Plant Upgrade Loan Authorization Bylaw No. 803, 2016.” The purpose of the bylaw is to borrow an amount not to exceed **\$4,128,739** to finance the cost of the Ashcroft Water Treatment Plant Upgrade that will be repaid over a period not to exceed 30 years.

A copy of “Ashcroft Water Treatment Plant Upgrade Loan Authorization Bylaw No. 803, 2016” is available from the Ashcroft Village Office, located at 601 Bancroft Street during each business day of the week (Monday to Friday except for holidays) between 8:00 am and 4:00 pm, except 12:00 pm to 1:00 pm for lunch.

Additional Information about Elector Eligibility:

A person must either be a resident elector or a non-resident property elector (not both) in order to sign this Elector Response Form.

A **resident elector** is an individual who is entitled to sign an Elector Response Form during an AAP by virtue of living within that jurisdiction. When signing an elector response form during an AAP, a resident elector must:

- be 18 years of age or older;
- be a Canadian citizen;
- have lived in British Columbia for at least six months;
- have lived in the Village of Ashcroft boundaries for at least 30 days;
- not be disqualified by the Local Government Act, any other Act, or the Courts from voting in a general local election.

A **non-resident property elector** is an individual that does not live in the jurisdiction and who is entitled to sign an elector response form during an AAP by virtue of owning property in that jurisdiction. When signing an elector response form during an AAP, a non-resident property elector must:

- be at least 18 years of age;
- be a Canadian citizen;
- have lived in British Columbia for at least six months;
- have owned property in the Village of Ashcroft boundary for at least 30 days;
- not be disqualified by the Local Government Act, any other Act, or the Courts from voting in a general local election.

Note: Only one non-resident property elector may sign an Elector Response Form per property, regardless of how many people own the property; and, that owner must have the written consent of a majority of the other property owner (s) to sign the response form on their behalf. **Property owned in whole or in part with a corporation does not qualify under the non-resident property elector provisions.**
