Residents of Ashcroft enjoyed two excellent days of hockey at the Drylands arena. Staff reported this was the busiest weekend in memory at the Arena.



Community Update

Mayor Jeyes and Council would like to take a few minutes of your time to tell you about a number of things they have been working on as well as some community events:

- Council recognized December 11th as A Day for Our Common Future, regarding the Salish Sea.
- Council resolved to send the Mayor and guest to the 2018 Clinton Annual Ball.
- Council resolved to participate in the 2018 Buy Local, Buy Fresh! campaign.
- Council approved the 2018 Calendar of Council Meeting Dates, which is now posted on the Village Website. www.ashcroftbc.ca > municipal services > council > meeting schedules
- Council authorized staff to submit applications for the following grants: Economic Capacity Development Grant; Love Ashcroft Program; and Business Façade Improvement Program; all through the NDIT.
- Council approve of staff's request to apply for a project extension for the UBCM Long Term Infrastructure and Asset Management Plan.
- Council resolved to commission the creation of a Mosaic to commemorate the Emergency Responders who served our community during the Elephant Hill Wildfire. The completed mosaic will be mounted on the exterior of Fire Hall No. 2
- Council approved the Grant-In-Aid request by the Ashcroft Navy League.
- Council adopted the Amendment Bylaw No. 814, cited as Village of Ashcroft Waste Removal and Disposal Bylaw No. 814, 2017.
- Council resolved to approve the Ashcroft Santa Claus Parade and to enter a Village vehicle into the parade.
- Council resolved to send the Mayor to the celebration of the Emperor of Japan's 84th Birthday celebration held by the Japanese Consulate in Vancouver.
- Council received delegations from TRU's Student Union and Urban Systems Ltd.

Vehicles must not be parked on Village streets for longer than 30 days

The Village would like to remind residents that vehicles must not be parked on Village streets and street shoulders for longer than 30 consecutive days, pursuant to Bylaw No. 753.

This includes any motorized vehicle, or trailer.

Residents are asked to relocate any of these vehicles on to their own private property, or to a suitable long-term storage area. As well, residents are not to store any items, other than garbage cans on designated garbage days, on street shoulders or sidewalks. This also includes decorative rocks or planters, as these items can interfere with snow clearing efforts.

Vehicles must have current registration.

As a reminder, no person may park a motorized vehicle or trailer on Village streets or street shoulders without affixed valid registration, at anytime.

Village staff will be stepping up efforts to identify vehicles and property owners in violation of these regulations. Notices will be sent to property owners requesting compliance.
