All voting opportunities will be held at the Ashcroft Community Hall: 409 Bancroft Street, Ashcroft, BC.

There is no need to pre-register to vote as the registration of all electors for this election will take place at the time of voting. You will be required to make a declaration that you meet the following requirements:

- 18 years of age or older on general voting day
- Canadian citizen
- resident of BC for at least 6 months immediately preceding the day of registration
- resident of OR registered owner of real property in the Village of Ashcroft for at least 30 days immediately preceding the day of registration, and
- not disqualified under the Local Government Act or any other enactment from voting in an election or otherwise disqualified by law.

Voters are required to bring with them two (2) pieces of identification.

Community Update

Mayor Jeyes and Council would like to take a few minutes of your time to tell you about a number of things they have been working on as well as some past community events:

- Council received a delegation from Dr. Sue Pollock and Heather Deegan from Interior Health to discuss piloting the Heat Alert and Response System (HARS) Planning Project in Ashcroft.
- Council received a delegation from Mike LoVecchio of CP Rail who discussed rail safety in light of it being Rail Safety Week as previously declared by Council.
- Mayor Jeyes and Councilor Trill attended the UBCM conference for the week of September 10 to 14 in Whistler and met with Minister Trevena of MOTI amongst other dignitaries and delegates.
- Council resolved to award a \$500 grant-in-aid to the Ashcroft/Cache Creek Rotary Club to hold Building Community with Non-Violent Communication Skills Workshop.
- Council has resolved to attend the Regional Chamber of Commerce information meeting on October 10.
- Council resolved to amend the Council remuneration policy.
- Council resolved to have the four wheels repaired on the Historic Freight Wagon.
- Council resolved to have staff sign the Letter of Agreement with Interior Health to begin the HARS planning project.
- Council resolved to have a “Veteran’s Way” street sign attached to the Legion.
- Council gave first three readings to Village of Ashcroft Indemnification and Council Remuneration Bylaw No. 824, 2018.
- Council gave second reading to the Official Community Plan, Bylaw No. 822 and the Zoning Bylaw, No. 823.

Ashcroft Resident’s Fall Yard Waste Pick Up takes place on October 17 & 18, 2018.

Please review the following guidelines:

- Branches less than 8" in diameter and 8' in length
- Leaves/grass/weeds/ twigs - MUST NOT BE BAGGED
- Non-refrigeration appliances
- Old tires (cannot be attached to rims)
- Each item cannot exceed 100lbs
- Total weight allowable per household is 1,000lbs
- Total max. volume of material per household is 4 cubic yards (6'x6'x3')
- Materials must be placed where it can be picked up by equipment, free of obstructions
- Materials must not be placed along the Highway right-of-way
- Materials must be kept separate and in defined piles (not spread out and not mixed)
- Materials cannot be placed against fences, buildings or retaining walls
- Nothing can be placed prior to October 10, 2018

Please call 250-453-9161 before 4:00 pm on October 16 to arrange for your materials to be picked up and hauled away. This service is provided to you at no additional charge by the Village.
