


COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

Council met June 18th & 24th. Here are some highlights from those meetings:

- ⇒ The draft 2023 Annual Report was introduced and made available for public input for 14 days at the June 18th Council meeting and adopted at the June 24th Council meeting
- ⇒ BC Transit has postponed the regionalization initiative to 2026.
- ⇒ Community BBQ has been rescheduled for July 20, 2024 from 11am—3pm at the Pool Park
- ⇒ Mayor and Council were updated on the branding community consultations held May 28th
- ⇒ Council approved the following Council Committee, Board and Working Group Appointments:
 - *Mayor Roden:* Governance, Public and Inter-Governmental Engagement, Managing Infrastructure and Assets
 - *Cnclr. Anstett:* Safety and Protection, Managing Infrastructure and Assets, Community Planning and the Natural Built Environment
 - Cnclr. Clement: Enhancing Parks Recreation, Arts and Culture Amenities, Governance, Public and Intergovernmental Engagement
 - Cnclr. Davenport: Enhancing Parks Recreation, Arts and Culture Amenities, Japanese Mural
 - *Cnclr. Lambert:* Japanese Mural, Safety and Protection Other appointment changes:
 - Cnclr. Anstett be removed from the Landfill Monitoring Committee and be appointed to the Transit Committee
 - Cnclr. Davenport be removed from the Transit Committee
- ⇒ Council was given an update from the CAO on the Housing Needs Assessment
- ⇒ The CFO provided the Q2 Financial and Financial update to Council
- ⇒ The EDTC Report for the Rebranding Initiative updated Council on the Community Consultations and survey results

HOT WEATHER

How to help beat the heat:

- ⇒ Always stay hydrated, drink plenty of water
- ⇒ Wear a hat and loose fitting clothing made of light coloured, breathable fabric
- ⇒ Take cool showers or baths to feel refreshed
- ⇒ Plan strenuous outdoor activities before 11am
- ⇒ Limit sun exposure
 and avoid sunburn use sunscreen with
 SPF 30 or higher. Remember, sunscreen
 will protect you from
 sunburn but not from
 the heat
- ⇒ Check on your friends and neighbours to make sure they are ok
- ⇒ NEVER leave people or pets inside vehicles during warmer weather
- ⇒ Have your home AC serviced to ensure it is working properly.



Once again, Ashcroft is in the middle of a very dry season. It is time for us to be proactive in our attempt to offset possible fires in our community. All homeowners are asked to look around your homes to see if there are potential fire hazards, no matter what they are, and remove them.

Many forms of cedar hedges and/or cedar trees are not very conducive to our drybelt climate. They can be a contributing factor and extreme fire hazard. Ashcroft Fire Rescue (AFR), together with the Village ask that when considering landscaping or re-landscaping your property, please avoid any types of cedar shrubs, trees, etc. that could potentially increase the risk of fire and loss of property.
