

Community Update

Mayor Jeyes and Council would like to take a few minutes of your time to tell you about a number of things they have been working on as well as some community events:

- Council supported a proposal by the District of West Kelowna to petition the Provincial Government to provide BC Local Governments 50% of the proposed Provincial Cannabis Tax Revenue.
- Council resolved to send the Mayor and CAO to attend the Thompson Watershed Flood and Debris Flow Disaster Mitigation Risk Assessment Workshop held in Kamloops in February.
- Council approved the budget for the 'Elephant Hill Emergency Responder Mosaic' project, in the amount of \$3520 to be created and mounted to the exterior of Ashcroft Fire Hall No. 2.
- Council passed Fees of Changes to Plans, Bylaws and the Issuance of Permits Bylaw No. 815, 2018.
- · Council received delegations from:
 - Sgt. Kat Thain of the Ashcroft RCMP Detachment presented a quarterly update of local police enforcement activity.
 - The Wellness and Health Action Coalition (WHAC) of Ashcroft presented to Council about local health care.
- Council resolved to provide the Ashcroft Community Hall, at no charge, to the Ashcroft and Area Community Resources Society to hold the 2018 Christmas Hamper Drive.
- Council resolved to not adopt the BC Energy Guide Step Codes into the Village building bylaws.
- Council resolved to have staff apply for funding through the 2018 Canada Summer Jobs Grant for four (4) summer student employees and for 11 trees through the Tree Canada program.
- Council appointed Michelle Allen and Wayne Robinson as the Chief and Deputy Chief Election Officers, respectively for the 2018 Village General Election.
