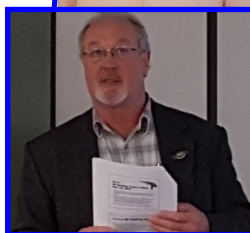

Community Update

Mayor Roden and Council would like to take a few minutes of your time to tell you about a number of things they have been working on as well as some past community events:

- TNRD has advised that the residents may now bring flexible plastic packaging to all Eco-Depots
- Council had a presentation from Regina Sadilkova, Director of Development Services and Pat Luscombe, Chief Building Inspector at the TNRD. They reviewed the Building Inspection services and recommended to Council that the permit fees be increased to be in line with all other communities within the TNRD.
- The Village has been approved to participate in the NDIT Building Façade Improvement Program
- Council sent a letter of support to declare February 1st as Royal Canadian Mounted Police Appreciate Day. The RCMP were formed on February 1, 1920 so will celebrate their centennial next year.
- Council will be hosting the Ashcroft Community Thank You Barbecue on Saturday, July 13 in Heritage Place Park
- MLA Tegart brought all of the area's elected officials together recently for a presentation on Ashcroft Terminal
- Council approved the use of the Drylands Arena for the 2019 Annual Fall Fair on September 8, 2019
- Marcie Down, Executive Director of Gold Country made a presentation to Council updating them on the various projects and activities
- Sandy Agatiello and Nancy White of the Ashcroft Moving Forward Group appeared before Council and brought them up to date on their activities. They have requested that an emergency preparedness committee be developed. Council will review this suggestion
- Janet Quesnel of the Ashcroft & District Curling Club provided Council with an overview of their past season. They were successful with their youth program and had approximately 55 curlers this past season.
